### Two programs are offered at Greenwood Scout Camp

#### Camp Heritage Cub Camp Program for Tiger, Wolf, Bear and 1<sup>st</sup> year Webelos – Friday to Sunday

Plan to arrive at 5:00 p.m. on your arrival day, (dinner WILL NOT be provided on Friday evening. Program ends at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday (dinner is not provided). **The Outpost begins after Cub Camp ends at 4:00 p.m.** (see Leader's Manual), and ends the next day by noon. (\$32 extra fee for Outpost).

Camp Whitewater Webelos Camp Program for 2<sup>nd</sup> year Webelos – Friday to Monday - Plan to arrive around 5:00 p.m. on your arrival day, dinner WILL NOT be provided on Friday evening. Program ends at 3:00 p.m. on Monday (dinner will not be provided). **The Outpost begins after Webelos Camp ends at 3:00 p.m.** (see Leader's Manual), and ends the next day before noon. (\$32 extra fee for Outpost).

Bring a backpack, to put your swimsuit, shoes, water bottles and other things you'll need throughout the day (you won't have many chances to return to your campsite). You may want to bring equipment such as Frisbees, softballs and gloves.

The uniform is highly recommended, but no Cub Scout is denied admittance because he does not own a uniform.

Adult and youth have separate shower facilities so please plan accordingly.

#### PROGRAMS AT CAMP:

With both programs, each Scout will participate in a variety of activities that are age progressive involving: camping, nature, climbing, swimming, boating, archery, BB-Guns, slingshots, downrange paintball (for Webelos), crafts, astronomy. Each program will guide Scouts to be more resourceful, self-reliant, have respect for the environment, build self-esteem, be fit, build teamwork, learn wise use of natural resources, and more. Among activities and interpersonal development, a wide range of advancement also takes place throughout the program. Both adults and Cubs participate in all the activities. ADVANCEMENTS: There will be many opportunities for your Cubs to achieve new experiences at camp. Our staff can help answer your questions; however, it is **your parents and leaders' responsibility to sign off on awards.**

HEALTH FORMS – **All youth & adults at camp are required to provide a completed health history form.** Please have forms with you at check-in, forms will not be returned at the end of the session. **DO NOT MAIL IN HEALTH FORMS.**

MEDICAL CARE: A camp Health Officer is on duty at all times to provide first aid treatment. Complete medical services are available in St Cloud. **The camp, or BSA, will not pay for any treatment given outside of camp.**

RELIGIOUS SERVICES: For camping sessions that extend over a Sunday, a non-denominational Christian worship service is conducted at camp. A listing of religious services in nearby communities is also available at camp.

FOOD SERVICE: Food is prepared and served in a dining shelter. Campers will set and clear tables. Campers may want to bring treats for campsite campfires the last evening. CAMP STORE: Campers will have the opportunity to purchase souvenirs, camping equipment, patches, and snacks at the camp's store. The camp store accepts cash, checks and credit cards, so please plan accordingly.

SWIM CHECKS: To provide additional aquatic time during the session **all participants (including adults)** will take their Swim Check **BEFORE** the program starts for their session. **Packs can choose to do their swim test prior to camp.** (Swim Classification form required, See Greenwood Leader's Manual) or when they first arrive at camp for check-in. HINT: wear your swimsuit to camp as it will be the first activity after you drop-off your gear.

# Camp Greenwood Maps

## Directions to Camp Greenwood from Minneapolis

Camp Greenwood is easily accessible by traveling west on Interstate 94 or Highway 55.

1. Travel west on Interstate 94 to the County Road 30 exit, turn left. Drive 8 miles to County Road 19, turn right. Continue on County Road 19 for 3.7 miles through Hanover, crossing the Crow River. Outside of Hanover, get in the left lane and turn left on County Road 34/10th Street NE. Drive 4.7 miles on County Road 34/10th St. NE to Garrison Avenue. Turn left on Garrison, drive 1 mile to Camp Greenwood.
2. Travel west on Highway 55 to Rockford. After crossing Crow River, turn right at stoplight in Rockford onto County Road 20/Main Street. Go 4 blocks on County Road 20/Main Street and turn left at Elm Street. Elm Street turns into Hamlin St. SE and County Road 33. After 4 miles turn right on Garrison (dirt road) and proceed 1.2 miles to Camp Greenwood.
