PARTICIPANT INFORMATION

Greenwood Scout Camp



Welcome: The Webelos Adventure Days program is held at Greenwood Scout Camp near Buffalo, MN.

Camp Schedule & Program: Camp gates open at 8:05 a.m., check-in runs from 8:05 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. Please try to arrive by 8:30 a.m. When you arrive, have your designated camp leader check-in the whole pack at registration. Activities end for the day at 3:00 p.m. (see schedule on reverse). Youth participating will work on a pin in the morning and in the afternoon, with free time being offered over the lunch hours. Scouts can choose to participate in archery, BB guns, action archery, and sling shots (parent permission required) or swimming.

Roster and Pin Sign-up Forms: Please fill out the enclosed Roster and Pin Sign-up form, **send it to the council office two weeks prior to your session at camp.** You will be informed of your pin sessions upon arrival at camp. (These forms can also serve as your list of those who paid and as a list for a reminder phone call to each Webelos before camp.) **Please make sure that you fill in a 2nd choice for all boys.** Make a copy for your pack, the camp will keep its copy.

Registration Policy: **All youth participants must be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America.** During check-in, camp rosters will be compared to pack charters. Applications must be filled out with the appropriate membership fees paid for all unregistered boys **before** they can participate.

Adult Role at Camp: Each pack must provide one (1) adult leader for every eight (8) Webelos, with a minimum of two (2) adults. The daily adult fee (\$9.00) includes lunch and participation in free time activities. The camp has full time staff members hired to run the events and activities; adult leaders are encouraged to help manage the group of Scouts and volunteer to assist.

Health History Forms: There are new health History forms for 2010, these forms need to be used. Last year's health forms **WILL NOT** be accepted. Every Webelos Scout **and** adult must have a completed health history form. This is not a physical, but simply an informational form to alert the staff of any health problems and to let them know who to notify in case of emergency. **Note parent signature required to shoot BB guns. All the health forms should be brought with you to camp. Please DO NOT mail-in to the office or camp.**

Medical Care: Basic first aid is given at the camp by a trained Health Officer. Complete medical services are available in Cannon Falls and Northfield. **Treatment given outside the camp is a family expense, not that of the camp or BSA.**

Telephone Service: The **Emergency Only** phone number at Camp Greenwood is 763-684-4243.

Food Service: Lunch is provided at camp as part of the Webelos Adventure Day fee for adults and youth in the camp's dining hall. Scouts and adults should bring their own water bottles for use throughout the day. Many special dietary needs can be accommodated with advance notice (i.e. peanut free, gluten/wheat free, vegetarian), contact atuchtenhagen@northernstarbsa.org or 651-254-9153 two weeks prior to attending camp.

Clothing: Uniforms are encouraged for the opening ceremony. Wear clothes comfortable for weather (including rain gear if necessary, all programs are on RAIN OR SHINE and are mainly held outdoors) and suitable active footwear. Hats, sunscreen, and insect repellent are also a good idea. Bring a swim suit and towel for swimming activities (the pool is open for free time activities.)

Trading Post: Webelos Scouts have the opportunity to buy souvenirs, camping equipment, extra camp patches, pop, and candy at the camp Trading Post. (Visa and MasterCard accepted)

Attention Leaders: Please note that the majority of the same activity pins that were offered last year will be offered again this year. New this year will be Leave No Trace and Fitness. Webelos who participated in the program last year are welcome to return. However, second year Webelos are encouraged to go to 5th Grade Webelos Resident Camp at Navajo or Greenwood Whitewater Camp where they will receive a different program geared towards getting ready for the adventure of moving into Boy Scouts.

Camp Greenwood Maps

Directions to Camp Greenwood from Minneapolis

Camp Greenwood is easily accessible by traveling west on Interstate 94 or Highway 55.

1. Travel west on Interstate 94 to the County Road 30 exit, turn left. Drive 8 miles to County Road 19, turn right. Continue on County Road 19 for 3.7 miles through Hanover, crossing the Crow River. Outside of Hanover, get in the left lane and turn left on County Road 34/10th Street NE. Drive 4.7 miles on County Road 34/10th St. NE to Garrison Avenue. Turn left on Garrison, drive 1 mile to Camp Greenwood.
2. Travel west on Highway 55 to Rockford. After crossing Crow River, turn right at stoplight in Rockford onto County Road 20/Main Street. Go 4 blocks on County Road 20/Main Street and turn left at Elm Street. Elm Street turns into Hamlin St. SE and County Road 33. After 4 miles turn right on Garrison (dirt road) and proceed 1.2 miles to Camp Greenwood.
