

NAVAJO WEBELOS CAMP



WELCOME - Tomahawk Scout Reservation, located on Long Lake, about 20 miles Northeast of Rice Lake, Wisconsin (110 miles from St. Paul), welcomes you to **Navajo Webelos Camp**.

CHECK IN TIME: 6:00 p.m. - 7:30 p.m.
(Saturday or Wednesday)

CHECK OUT TIME: 1:00 p.m.
(Tuesday or Saturday)

Dinner is **NOT** provided on the first night.

CAMP ADDRESS - You can write to your Webelos Scout while he is at camp. Be sure to include:

Mail should be sent **before** your Webelos leaves for camp as it takes a few days for mail to arrive.

PROGRAM - The program will include activities in Ecology, Scoutcraft, archery, swimming, boating, climbing, BB gun target shooting, activity badge requirements, and campfires. Adults are expected to provide leadership to Webelos during activity times. For more details about the programs and basic information, view the leaders' manual at www.goscouting.org/forms. You will then be able to view all the Navajo information.

TELEPHONE SERVICE - Telephone service is available at the camp office. Calls to Webelos Scouts or adults should only be for emergency situations. The camp phone number is (715) 354-3841. Allow one to three hours for a return call as the person you are calling may be out of the central camp area. A pay phone is available for outgoing calls.

MEDICAL CARE - A camp health officer serves as a regular member of the camp staff, and is on call at all times. In the event of serious accidents, illness or hospitalization, parents are contacted. Medical care given at camp is without charge to parents. **Treatment given outside the camp is a family expense, or is filed with the family's insurance company.**

Each person attending Navajo Camp is required to provide a completed health history form upon check-in at camp.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES - Christian chaplains serve the camp and provide worship services. In addition, they provide counseling and program assistance throughout the week. An Interfaith service is also available.

MEAL SERVICE - At Navajo Camp, your food is prepared and served in the dining hall. Campers are expected to share the responsibility for setting and clearing tables. Campers may want to bring popcorn, marshmallows, or other treats for den or small group campfires. (Lunch is served on the last day.)

BLACK BEAR EDUCATION is required to be done with all participants who come to Tomahawk and it is **MANDATORY**. Groups will not be allowed past check-in until camp has received a signed copy stating that you have completed the training with everyone in your group. (Two person canvas wall tents on wooden platforms and folding cots are provided.)

NOTE - The uniform is highly recommended, but no Webelos Scout is denied admittance because he does not own one.

Trading Post – Campers have the opportunity to buy souvenirs, camping equipment, patches, pop, ice cream, and candy at the Camp Trading Post.

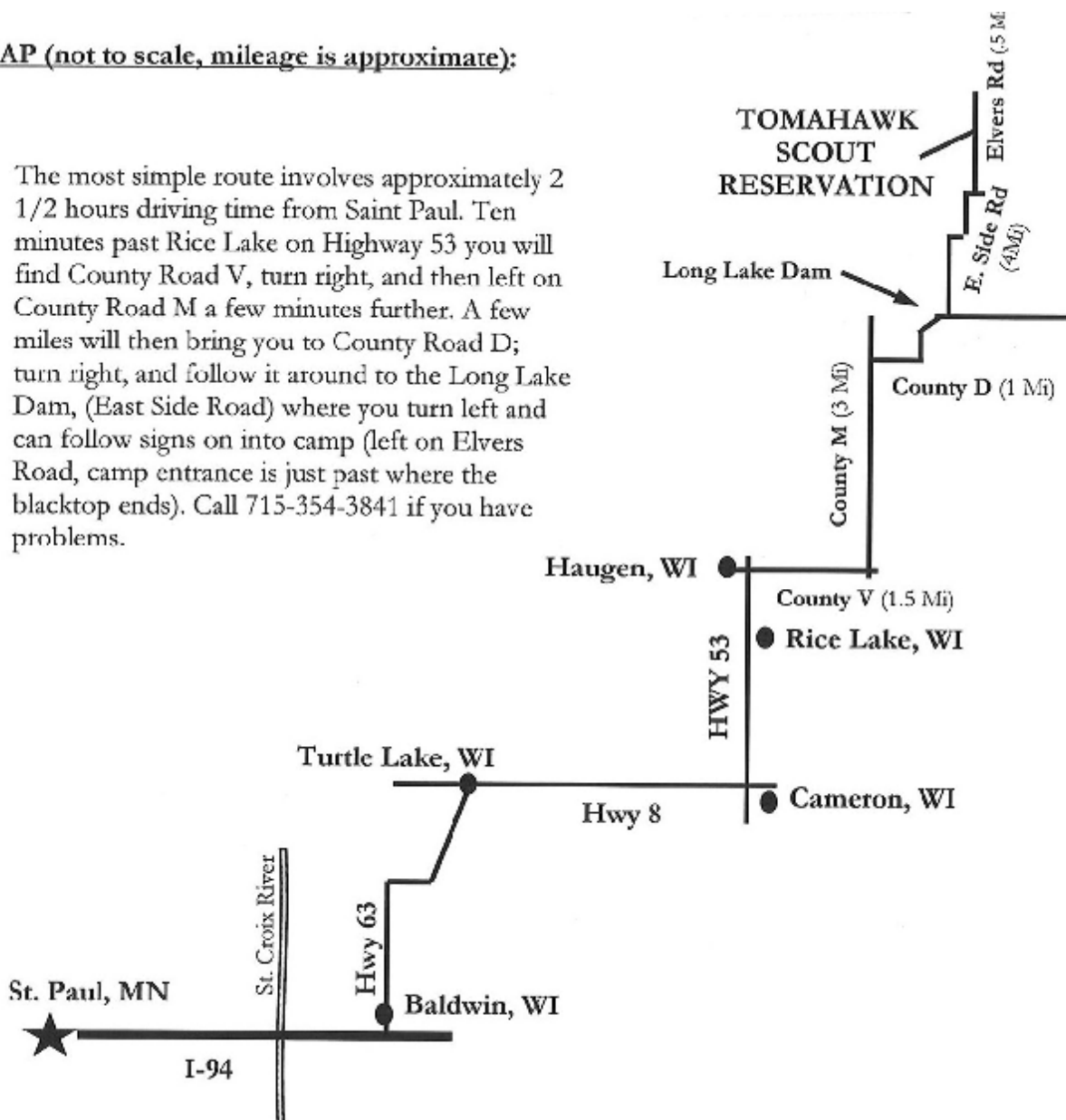
FEES - **Balance of fees are due March 16 or within two weeks after making reservations.**



CHECK-IN/CHECK-OUT TIMES: Plan to arrive in Tomahawk for check-in **between 6:00 pm and 7:30 pm.** Please be punctual. Have your health forms ready at this time. Showing up on time will allow you enough time to bring your equipment to your campsite, set it up, and be ready for the camp-wide meeting that evening. At this meeting, you will be given further information regarding your stay. **Check-out starts at 1:00 p.m. on your last day.** Sign up for check-out times after breakfast on the last day.

MAP (not to scale, mileage is approximate):

The most simple route involves approximately 2 1/2 hours driving time from Saint Paul. Ten minutes past Rice Lake on Highway 53 you will find County Road V, turn right, and then left on County Road M a few minutes further. A few miles will then bring you to County Road D; turn right, and follow it around to the Long Lake Dam, (East Side Road) where you turn left and can follow signs on into camp (left on Elvers Road, camp entrance is just past where the blacktop ends). PARKING: All cars must remain in the parking lot. The in-camp road is reserved for camp vehicles only. If for any reason you need to drive into Navajo camp, you absolutely must first receive permission from the Navajo Camp Director. If you would like to visit a troop in another camp, please observe the reservation-wide speed limit of 15 mph. Be mindful of pedestrian safety.

LEADERS' ROUNDTABLE: On the night that your pack arrives, a Roundtable will be held to further explain the schedule and review camp policies. We will ask for two or three adults from each campsite to attend who will act as leaders for their campsite.
